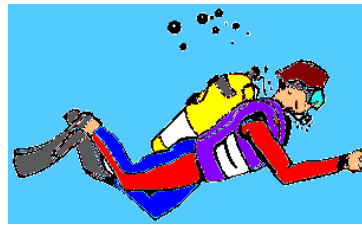

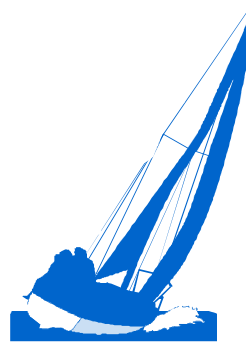

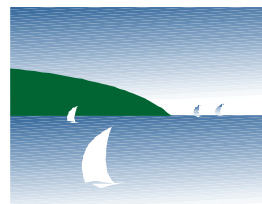

nut allergies). Tom+Chee goes the extra mile to serve all their customers food that is awesome and fresh!

Spotlighting quality ingredients and friendly customer service, T+C's founders have grown this quirky grilled cheese business from a tiny food tent on a public square in Cincinnati to a rapidly expanding franchise empire, thanks to TV exposure and an investment deal on ABC's "Shark Tank." Their Grilled Cheese Donut has been featured on ABC's "The Chew", Travel Channel's "Man v. Food Nation" and was named one of America's best new sandwiches by NBC's "Today" show.

Both The Color Exchange and Oulipo will be performing at the Cat's Cradle afterwards; so, we can enjoy them after our delicious dinners! The Color Exchange is a band from Chapel Hill, formed in 2012 by songwriting partners Justin Ellis (bass, vocals) and Chris Petto (guitars), beginning under the name, Clockwork Kids. Late 2014 saw dramatic lineup and stylistic changes, leading the band to a new name and identity. Since its inception, the band has toured extensively throughout North America, opened for such acts as Cymbals Eat Guitars, Weekend, and The Apache Relay, performed at a TED conference and on NPR, ran a successful Kickstarter campaign, and self-released two records. Joined by Chris McCarty (keyboards) and Brett Scott (percussion), the band aims to create a refined and layered alternative indie rock sound, exploring new sonic territories while maintaining catchy, approachable songs that bring out the best of pop. In April 2015, the band released "Cubed", their first album as The Color Exchange. *"Give Oulipo's latest EP a few measures and its title, Primitive Ways, makes sense — skittering beats and cavernous, reverberating vocals overwhelm as a few witchy howls drive the point home... 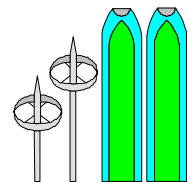

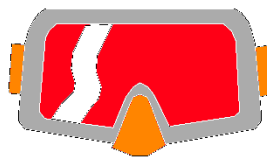

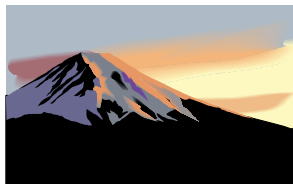
